
The Cruise in Company leg between Fredrikstad and Lerwick will provide an exciting opportunity for the participating crews of the Tall Ships Races 2023 to explore the coastlines, towns and villages of the Norwegian and Scottish Coastlines.

This programme details the adventures and activities awaiting your crew in the Scottish Guest Harbours.

A Cruise in Company is not a competitive event, but instead offers hospitality, friendship and shared experiences for crews and communities to enjoy together.

Each Guest Harbour has provided a programme of activities which allows ships' crew to engage with the local community's culture, heritage, food and drink and public entertainment. Many activities are specifically offered for crew members, with other events inclusive of the public as a way to celebrate the opportunity of inviting vessels from the Tall Ships Races into city or rural locations.

Guest Harbours welcome the opportunity to host ships on the Cruise in Company and share the hospitality and friendship of their communities. The programme of activities on offer is set out in this programme and you are invited to join in our extended Tall Ships welcome.



Scottish Guest Harbours will vary in size, capacity and facilities.

Aberdeen is a larger city harbour, where Stromness, Cullivoe and Baltasound are smaller village harbours – all offering a warm welcome and good berthing.

There will be no berthing charges at any of the Guest Harbours, though advance booking is required to ensure space is available and reserved. Shore power facilities may vary and advance notification of requirements should be given. Fresh water will be available in all locations.

It is taken for granted that all participating ships have the necessary insurance required by UK and international law.



UK Border Entry Requirements

GAC will provide free assistance with UK Border Force reporting requirements for entering UK ports on the Cruise in Company. Ships will have a single point of contact, regardless of initial entry to a Guest Harbour or the port of Lerwick.


Each Guest Harbour has a main contact, listed here, to answer any direct questions you may have in regard to their activities programme.

Spotting Shetland Ponies, Highland Cattle, and other points of interest along the way.




